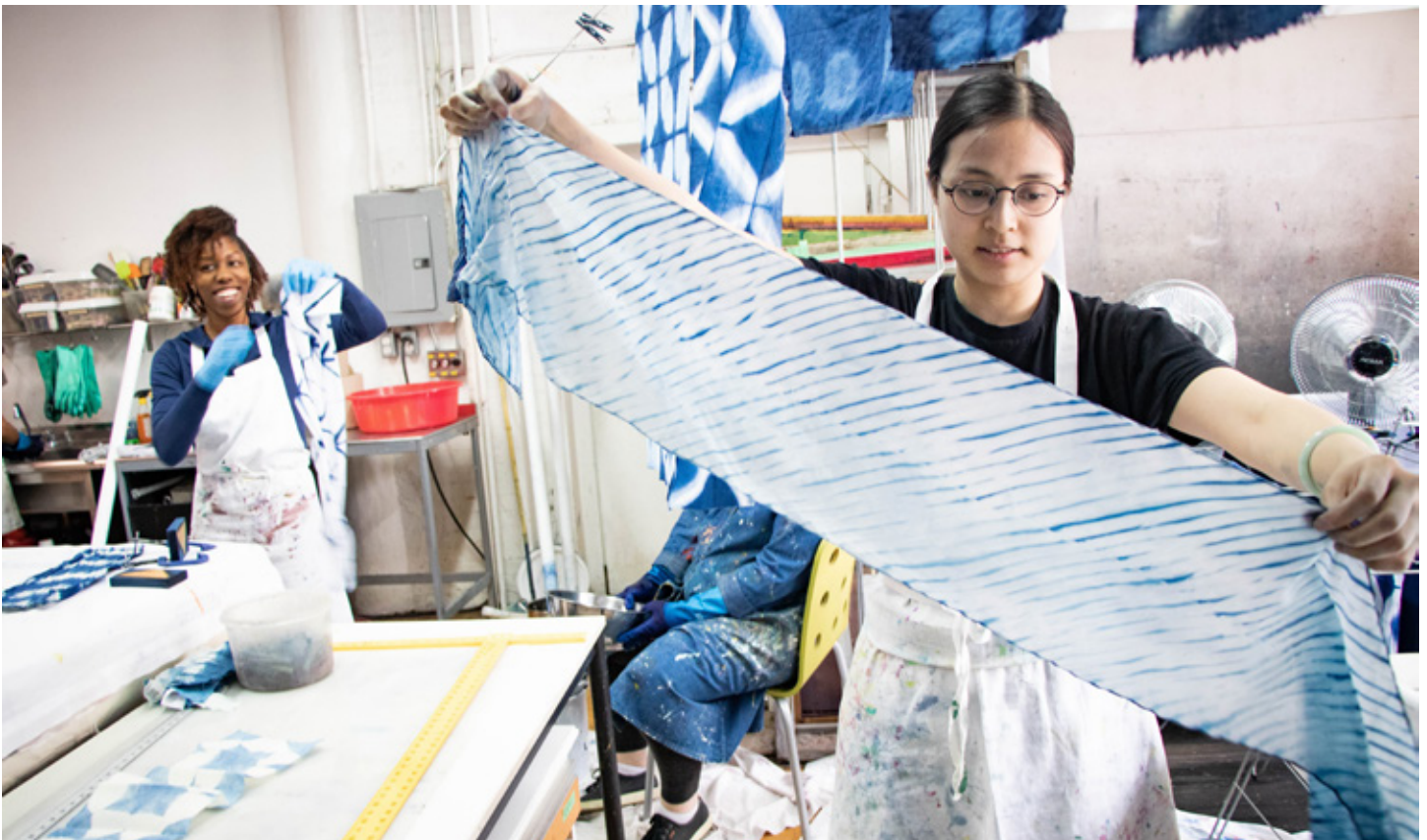

LISTE DES SUBVENTIONS

The Ontario Arts Council's (OAC) 2019-2020 Grants Listing reports on all grant amounts paid to organizations and individuals throughout the fiscal year (April 1, 2019, to March 31, 2020). The report also includes final payments made in the 2019-2020 fiscal year related to grant results announced in previous years (this can occur when a grant has been awarded with conditions that are not met until a subsequent fiscal period). Because this report is a snapshot representing a fixed point in time, the reader of this report may see listings for granting programs that no longer exist or have changed names.

The grants listings are listed under the following four streams:

- Creating and Presenting
- Building Audiences and Markets
- Engaging Communities and Schools
- Developing Careers and Arts Services

OAC's six priority groups are a key focus in all programs, which remain discipline based, activity based or priority-group based.

This report includes the final grants awarded under the Indigenous Culture Fund, a fund administered by OAC between 2017 and 2019 on behalf of the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (now called the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries).

Finally, OAC also administers the selection process for a number of privately funded awards and grants, including programs funded through the Chalmers Family Fund and the Johanna Metcalf Performing Arts Prizes. The OAC administers the Premier's Awards for Excellence in the Arts (currently under review) and the Pauline McGibbon Award on behalf of the Government of Ontario as well as several awards on behalf of the Ontario Arts Foundation.

La *Liste des subventions 2019-2020* du Conseil des arts de l'Ontario (CAO) fait état de tous les montants versés aux organismes et aux particuliers pendant l'exercice financier qui va du 1^{er} avril 2019 au 31 mars 2020. Ce rapport comprend également les derniers versements effectués au cours de l'exercice 2019-2020 pour des subventions annoncées au cours de l'exercice précédent (cela peut se produire lorsqu'une subvention a été accordée sous réserve de conditions qui ne sont remplies qu'au cours de l'exercice suivant). Étant donné que ce rapport donne un aperçu d'une période précise, on peut y trouver des informations liées à des programmes de subventions qui n'existent plus ou qui ont changé de nom.

La liste des subventions est structurée en fonction des quatre filières suivantes :

- Création et diffusion
- Collaboration avec les communautés et les écoles
- Développement des publics et des marchés
- Renforcement des carrières et des services aux arts

Les six groupes prioritaires du CAO sont une cible privilégiée de tous les programmes, qui continuent à être axés sur une discipline, une activité ou un groupe prioritaire.

Ce rapport comprend les subventions finales accordées dans le cadre du Fonds culturel autochtone, fonds administré par le CAO de 2017 à 2019 pour le ministère du Tourisme, de la Culture et du Sport (appelé maintenant ministère des Industries du patrimoine, du sport, du tourisme et de la culture).

Enfin, le CAO gère également le processus de sélection de plusieurs prix et subventions provenant de fonds privés, notamment les programmes financés par le Fonds de la famille Chalmers et les prix Johanna-Metcalf des arts de la scène. Le CAO administre les Prix du premier ministre pour l'excellence artistique (en cours de révision) et le prix Pauline McGibbon au nom du gouvernement de l'Ontario ainsi que plusieurs prix au nom de la Fondation des arts de l'Ontario.

How grant applications are assessed

Where applicable, the listings also include the names of assessment panel members for each program deadline. In most cases, OAC uses one of three peer assessment models to review applications and make grant decisions:

- Juries are generally used for project programs. The jury is made up of professional artists and other arts professionals from across the province who determine which applicants should receive grants and decide on the grant amount if the program does not already have a predetermined grant level.
- Advisory panels are used for operating programs and some project programs. The advisors who serve on the panel are professional artists and other professionals in the field. They are responsible for assessing applications and providing advice on funding priorities. Unlike jurors, advisors do not make final decisions on grant amounts and instead make recommendations to OAC that are submitted to the CEO and the Board of Directors for approval.
- Third-party recommenders are organizations or collectives authorized by OAC to receive applications, review them and make grant recommendations. OAC allocates a budget to each of the participating recommenders. Recommenders submit their grant recommendations to OAC, which are then reviewed by OAC for applicant and project eligibility.

For certain deadlines (year two and year three of a multi-year funding cycle, for example), funding requests are reviewed internally by OAC program officers. Ensuring the relevance, fairness and consistency of OAC programs, and therefore the process for allocating grants, is both rigorous and complex. Individual applicants are never asked to sit on juries or advisory panels for programs in which they have an application being assessed. An arts professional employed by an organization receiving multi-year funding may act as an assessor as long as their organization is not being assessed at that deadline.

L'évaluation des demandes de subventions

S'il y a lieu, la liste comprend aussi le nom des membres des groupes d'évaluateurs pour chaque date limite des programmes. Dans la plupart des cas, le CAO utilise l'un de trois modèles d'évaluation par les pairs pour examiner les demandes et prendre les décisions en matière de subvention :

- Les jurys sont généralement utilisés pour les programmes de projets. Ils sont composés d'artistes professionnels et d'autres professionnels des arts qui sélectionnent les candidats méritant d'être subventionnés et déterminent le montant de la subvention si le programme n'a pas déjà un niveau de subvention prédéterminé.
- Les comités d'évaluation sont utilisés pour les programmes de fonctionnement et certains programmes de projets. Les conseillers qui y siègent sont des artistes professionnels et d'autres professionnels du domaine en question qui sont chargés d'évaluer les demandes et de donner des conseils sur les priorités de financement. Contrairement aux jurés, les conseillers ne prennent pas les décisions sur le montant des subventions, mais font des recommandations qui sont soumises à la directrice générale et au conseil d'administration du CAO pour approbation.
- Les tiers recommandataires sont des organismes ou des collectifs autorisés par le CAO à recevoir les demandes, à les examiner et à faire au CAO des recommandations de subventions. Le CAO attribue un budget à chacun des organismes recommandataires. Ces derniers soumettent leurs recommandations de subventions au CAO, qui examine ensuite les recommandations pour vérifier l'admissibilité des candidats et des projets.

Pour certaines dates limites (comme par exemple l'exercice 2 et 3 d'un cycle de financement pluriannuel), les demandes sont examinées à l'interne par les responsables des programmes du CAO. La procédure suivie pour assurer la pertinence, l'impartialité et la cohérence des programmes du CAO et, par conséquent, du processus d'octroi des subventions, est à la fois rigoureuse et complexe. Le CAO n'invite jamais des candidats individuels à siéger à un jury ou à un comité d'évaluation pour un programme dans le cadre duquel leur demande est évaluée. Les professionnels des arts employés par des organismes bénéficiant d'une subvention pluriannuelle peuvent servir d'évaluateurs, pour autant que leur organisme ne fasse pas l'objet d'une évaluation à la date limite en question.



CREATING AND PRESENTING

CRÉATION ET DIFFUSION

The Creating and Presenting stream is the largest of the four streams in the Ontario Arts Council's funding framework. The programs offered through this stream fulfil the first half of OAC's organizational mandate – to foster the creation and production of art – by providing project and operating support to professional artists and arts organizations. This helps build a vital arts sector in Ontario and ensures access to the arts, which makes all of our lives richer.

While most of the programs in the Creating and Presenting stream are designed to provide support by artistic discipline, OAC also offers programs designated for specific priority groups and geographic regions. This approach ensures that the needs of diverse arts communities across the province are met and that various cultural and practical approaches to artistic creation are recognized and supported. We believe that works of artistic merit are created by artists from all communities, regions and cultural backgrounds.

La filière Création et diffusion est la plus grande des quatre filières du cadre de financement du Conseil des arts de l'Ontario et répond à la première moitié du mandat de notre organisme : favoriser la création et la production artistiques. Les programmes qu'elle offre accordent aux artistes professionnels et aux organismes artistiques des subventions de projets et de fonctionnement qui contribuent au dynamisme du secteur artistique de l'Ontario et assurent un accès aux arts qui enrichit nos vies à tous.

Si la plupart des programmes de subventions de la filière Création et diffusion sont axés sur une discipline artistique, le CAO offre également des programmes destinés à des groupes prioritaires et à des régions géographiques précises. Cette approche permet de répondre aux besoins des différents milieux artistiques de la province et de promouvoir différentes démarches culturelles ou différentes pratiques de la création artistique. Nous sommes convaincus que des œuvres artistiques méritoires sont créées par des artistes de toutes les communautés, de toutes les régions et de tous les horizons culturels.

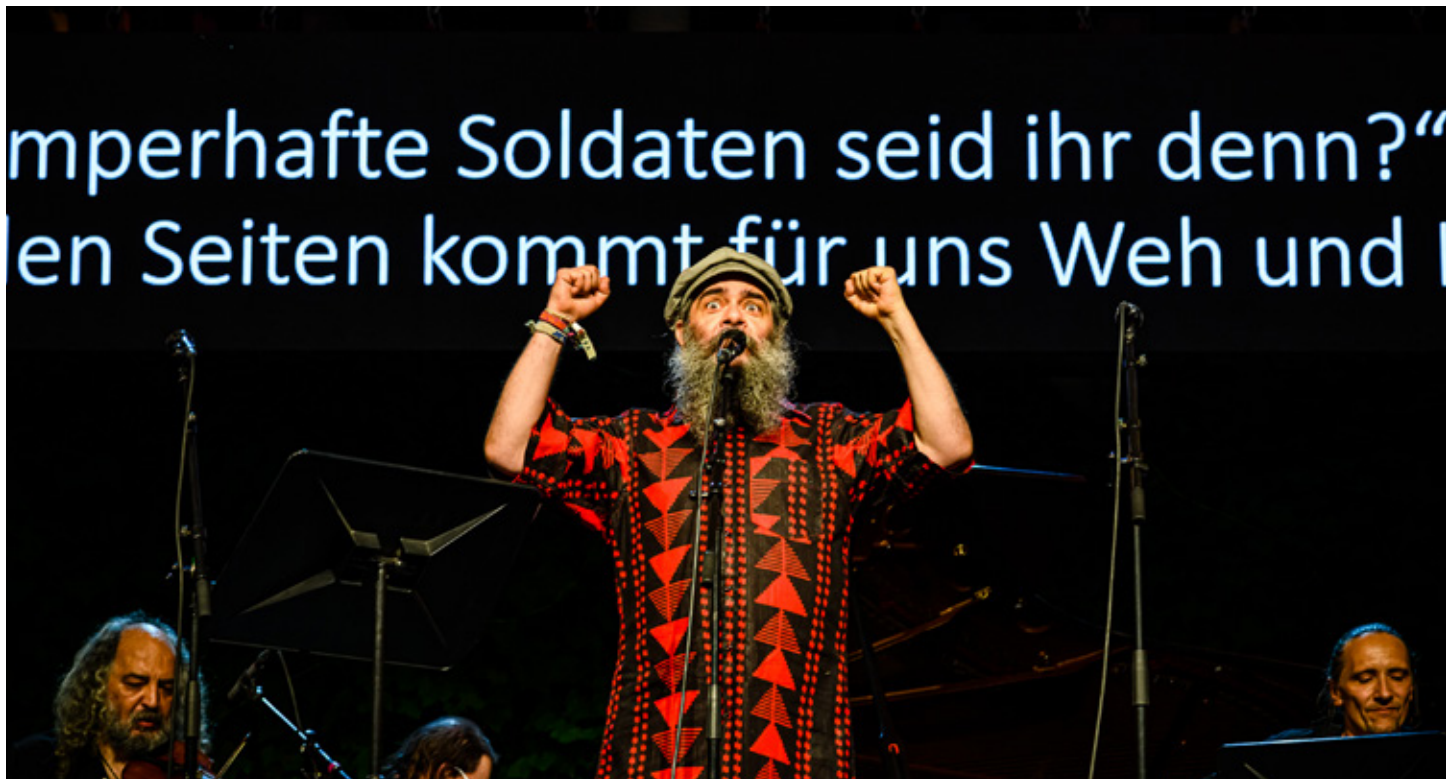

The Indigenous Culture Fund (ICF) was a fund administered by the Ontario Arts Council from 2017 to 2019 on behalf of the Province of Ontario through what was then the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (now called the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism, and Culture Industries).

Three Indigenous Culture Fund programs supported opportunities for First Nation, Inuit and Métis Peoples to develop and deliver community-based cultural projects and build traditional knowledge capacity. These projects included initiatives and activities such as language learning; opportunities for cross-generational knowledge sharing through youth-led or Elder-led projects; and participation in ceremonies, protocols and land-based activities.

The only remaining of the three programs is the ICF Project Grants for Organizations, which supported multi-year projects. Although the ICF program has ended, some of the remaining payments for these grants are included in this document.

Le Fonds culturel autochtone (FCA) était un fonds administré par le Conseil des arts de l'Ontario de 2017 à 2019 au nom de la province de l'Ontario par l'intermédiaire de ce qui était alors le ministère du Tourisme, de la Culture et du Sport (appelé maintenant ministère des Industries du patrimoine, du sport, du tourisme et de la culture).

Trois programmes du Fonds culturel autochtone offraient aux Premières Nations, aux Inuits et aux Métis la possibilité d'élaborer et de réaliser des projets culturels communautaires et de renforcer les capacités en matière de connaissances traditionnelles. Ces projets comprenaient des initiatives et des activités telles que l'apprentissage de la langue, le partage de connaissances entre les générations grâce à des projets dirigés par des jeunes ou des aînés, et la participation à des cérémonies, des protocoles et des activités liées à la terre.

L'un des trois programmes, FCA – subventions de projets pour les organismes, finançait des projets pluriannuels. Ce programme est désormais clos, mais certains des derniers versements de ces subventions sont inclus dans ce document.

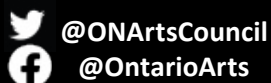
